Preparing your talk:

- Include as your first slide a title slide that clearly states: your name, your organisational affiliations and your presentation title.
- 8mins presentation + 2mins questions.
- PowerPoint slides should be in widescreen 16:9 format. This is essential for optimal viewing.
- Ensure text and figures are clearly legible.
- You will be presenting to a multidisciplinary audience so please pitch your presentation accordingly.
- N.B. there is NO poster component of this presentation

On the day:

- Your presentation will be made at the Monash Institute of Pharmaceutical Sciences (MIPS). A live stream of your presentation will also be made available to registrants unable to attend the Symposium in person.
- During the session, you will share your PPT presentation and deliver your presentation from the PC computer
 at MIPS, onto which your talk will have been pre-loaded and linked to our master slides. (Please note that we
 require that you share your Powerpoint presentation with us by Wednesday 2 November via the form above, so
 we can link your talk to our master slides in a timely way.)
- A timer will be used to ensure that all speakers get their 10 minute time frame. Notification will be given 30 seconds before the 8 minutes is up. Anyone not finished within the time allotted will be kindly asked to stop their presentation.
- At the conclusion of your 8 minute presentation, you may be asked questions from the audience for up to 2
- Judges will be assessing your presentation on a number of criteria for the awarding of prizes.

 person present their talk strictly within the 3 min timeframe: please prepare your slides accordingly, as below.
- Include as your first slide a title slide that clearly states: your name, your organisational affiliations and your presentation title.
- 3 minutes maximum for the presentation with 1 MINUTE FOR QUESTIONS
- PowerPoint slides should be in widescreen 16:9 format. This is essential for optimal viewing on the Zoom platform. Ensure text and figures are clearly legible.
- Absolutely no animations. No acknowledgement slide is to be presented.
- Up to 3 data slides only. The title slide, described above, is extra, for a total of 4 slides.
- You will be presenting to a multidisciplinary audience so please pitch your presentation accordingly.
- N.B. there is NO poster component of this presentation

On the day:

- Your presentation will be made at the Monash Institute of Pharmaceutical Sciences (MIPS). A live stream of your presentation will also be made available to registrants unable to attend the Symposium in person.
- During the session, you will share your PPT presentation and deliver your presentation from the computer at MIPS, onto which your talk will have been pre-loaded and linked to our master slides (Please note that we require that you share your Powerpoint presentation with us by Wednesday 2 November via the form above, so we can link your talk to our master slides in a timely way.)
- A timer will be used to ensure that all speakers get their 3 minute time frame. Notification will be given 20 seconds before the 3 minutes is up. Anyone not finished within the time allotted will be kindly asked to stop their presentation.
- 1 or 2 questions may be asked after each Science Bite presentation, for a total of 1 extra minute. Judges will be assessing your presentation on a number of criteria for the awarding of prizes.

There will be two poster sessions: one at lunch time (approximately 12.30pm to 1.30pm, time to be confirmed) and one in the evening (approximately 5pm to 6pm, time to be confirmed). If there are extremely important reasons as to why you may not be able to attend part of the Symposium, you must email us by this date to tell us your availability for the day. We will do our best to accommodate your schedule, but cannot guarantee allocating you to a specific timeslot in the program.

On the day:

- We will have approximately 22 participants in each poster session (one during lunchtime and one in the evening, as noted above).
- Lunchtime poster session presenters should:
 - Hang their posters on arrival
 - Remove their posters promptly at the conclusion of lunch
- Evening poster session presenters should:
 - o Hang their posters at the afternoon tea break
 - o Remove their posters promptly at the conclusion of the evening poster session
- Please check the program carefully as to which session you are scheduled to present in.
- Velcro dots will be supplied by VIIN to allow you to adhere your poster to the poster board
- Poster prize judges will be visiting posters and expecting to speak to presenters during their poster session.
 Please be present at your poster for at least the first 45 minutes of each poster session, both for delegates wishing to speak to you about your work and for judges. Consider asking a friend to bring you catering at your poster.
- Storage for posters will be available. The specific location for storage will be provided closer to the date of the symposium.

Preparing your poster

- Maximum poster size is A0. Poster display space is limited if your poster does not adhere to these size restrictions there may not be room to display it.
- We also request that you **prepare a spiel of no more than a minute** with which to present your poster to the judges during your session as they will each have a number of posters to assess and only limited time.
- Include your name, your organisational affiliations and your poster title. Ensure text and figures are clearly legible.
- You will be presenting to a multidisciplinary audience so please pitch your presentation accordingly
