#### VICTORIAN EUREKA PRIZE WINNERS

The Hendra Virus Research Team from CSIRO Australian Animal Health Laboratory in Geelong were recently awarded the Eureka Prize for Infectious Diseases Research.

Dr Glenn Marsh (right) and the team were awarded the prize in recognition of their work creating a vaccine and treatment for the deadly Hendra virus; the first group to do so.

The group also researches other bat-borne zoonoses such as Nipah and Ebola viruses.



Glenn will be a guest speaker in the Emerging Infectious Diseases session at the upcoming Lorne Infection and Immunity Conference.

Other Victorian winners included the B-cell Team at Walter and Eliza Hall Institute who were awarded the Eureka Prize for Scientific Research for their work on plasma cell differentiation and survival.

#### VIIN RESEARCHERS VISIT CHINA

Following an initial workshop at VIDRL in 2008, VIIN scientists from the Doherty Institute are travelling to China this November for the Melbourne-Fudan Infection and Immunity Workshop. The visit is funded by University of Melbourne's International Research and Research Training Fund. A range of basic science and public health topics will be covered, including persistent and hospital acquired infections.
